## OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH (OSHA) ADMINISTRATION CERTIFICATE

- 3. That employees to be employed in the work subject to this bid have successfully completed a course in construction safety and health approved by the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration that is at least 10 hours in duration.
