

FINANCIAL AID

72% of QCC students from South County receive financial aid such as: Federal and State loans, private loans, grants, and scholarship funds

206 of those South County residents who receive financial aid are receiving college-funded grants and scholarships

65% of first-time, full-time, degree/certificate-seeking students received financial assistance

\$2,354,397 total dollar amount in collegefunded grants and scholarships awarded to all QCC students

FOOD INSECURITY (HUNGER)²

18.5% of Southbridge residents live below the poverty level³

11% of students are homeless.

54% of students are in an insecure housing situation.

49% of students have low or very low food security and go hungry on a regular basis.

7.0% experienced all three forms of basic needs insecurity (housing, hunger, & homelessness).


