

Colleges and universities in Worcester are helping students from Becker College by waiving transfer fees, dedicating advisors, welcoming athletes

Hours after Becker College in Worcester announced it [would close permanently](#) following the spring semester, the city's other universities and colleges came to the aid of school's students. Five colleges and universities in Worcester - Assumption University, Clark University, Quinsigamond Community College, Worcester Polytechnic Institute and Worcester State University - have already set up plans to welcome Becker College students in the fall.

Each institution of higher education either has plans or agreements with Becker regarding specific programs and majors to help students continue learning in the fall semester.

Here's a breakdown of how each college or university in Worcester plans to help students from Becker College.

Quinsigamond Community College

Quinsigamond Community College has developed a transfer agreement and memorandum of understanding with Becker College.

The agreement allows for all Becker students to transfer to similar programs at QCC.

The programs include earning an associate degrees in business administration, criminal justice, early childhood education and nurse education.

QCC also said that related programs can transfer over as well, such as gaming and esports.

All current and prospective Becker students will be offered the same financial support and services offered to QCC students, which includes Student Emergency Funds.
