“The Wounded World: W.E.B. Du Bois, African Americans and World War I”

Nov. 11 marks the centennial of the end of World War I. One hundred years earlier, W. E. B. Du Bois, the acclaimed black scholar and activist, embarked on a journey to understand the meaning of the war for African Americans and the world.

Dr. Chad Williams tells the story of Du Bois's decades-long effort to write the history of the black experience in the war and the lessons of the war for our present wounded world.



Chad Williams is the Spector Professor of History and African and African American Studies at Brandeis University. He is author of the award-winning book *Torchbearers of Democracy: African American Soldiers in the World War I Era*.
